



Dublin: City of Science

Dublin will host the Euroscience Open Forum (ESOF), from the 11-15 July 2012, which is the biennial pan-European meeting dedicated to scientific research and innovation. The event is expected to bring together more than 5,000 scientists, business leaders, government officials, policy-makers and international scientific media representatives to discuss the best of European science. The programme aims to present the latest developments in science and technology, stimulate public interest and foster a dialogue on the role of science and technology in society and public policy. It brings together scientists and officials to address all of the major global challenges, which include the topics of energy, climate change, food and health. The spotlight placed on Ireland during the ESOF will “provide Ireland with an opportunity to claim our place in the world as a country that is serious about science and serious about using science to advance the general goals in society.
